Dear Alumni, Families and Friends,

As the 2016-2017 school year came to a close, I wanted to start this letter by saying-THANK YOU. Thank you to all that gave to JCA through their time, talents, and treasures. We are a community built on TRADITION, SPIRITUALITY, and FAMILY to which you have played a major role. On behalf of our students, faculty and staff, and administration, we are eternally grateful to the mark that you make on our school on a daily basis. We could not be Joliet Catholic Academy without your support.

So we turn the page on another successful academic campaign, and have just congratulated the Class of 2017 on a stellar year. Our graduates earned more than 15 million dollars in college scholarships, which we feel is a great return on investment for our families. Our students logged more than 16,000

hours of community service and have once again set the bar for ACT /College readiness with their remarkable test scores. We feel that our students are prepared for college and the world and have the necessary tools to be leaders in their fields.

Regarding our Capital Initiative, we are excited to report that we are about two-thirds complete with Phase II. Our 1:1 technology initiative saw much success in its first year; we have successfully completed an AdvancED accreditation review and are accredited once again for five years through this national organization. Our curriculum next year features exciting new additions such as Engineering and Robotics. We always want to make sure that our students are getting the best opportunities to succeed and thrive. We will always make sure that we are preparing them for their future.

On behalf of the administration, faculty and staff, I hope that you have a wonderful summer and Thank You once again for all that you do for JCA!

Joliet Catholic graduate finds the cause of his life in Syria

Last spring, ready to leave for a medical mission to Greece to help Syrian refugees who had survived crossing the Mediterranean Sea. Dr. John Kahler (JCHS) '65) heard about the death of the last pediatrician in East Aleppo in an airstrike



on al-Quds Hospital in the war-torn and divided city.

"I contacted the head of [the Syrian American Medical Society] and I said, 'Send me, I'll go,'" recounted Kahler, a 70-year old pediatrician who just retired on Jan.1.

Kahler lives in Palos Park with his second wife. Cecelia McClellan, but was born and raised in Lockport.

McClellan, a social worker, said it was agreed early on that "he'll 'save the world' and I'll take care of the family."

He's "had the itch" to travel all his life, Kahler said, and has spent the last 20 years traveling to places like New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina as well as Haiti, Africa and Latin America on short-term medical missions.

But Syria was to be unlike any other mission, in a number of ways.

East Aleppo is one of the most dangerous places in the world, with daily airstrikes by the government of President Bashar al-Assad on the rebel-held area.

Dr. Zaher Sahloul, a critical care specialist from Burr Ridge who is also with SAMS, said Kahler repeated that request to him in Greece.

"I told him, 'It's very risky, especially for an American physician," Sahloul said. "Physicians in general are targeted by the Assad regime."

Sahloul, a Syrian-American who volunteered in Syria 14 times - five of them in East Aleppo - since the beginning of the civil war six years ago, knew firsthand the dangers Khaler would face.

The Road to Aleppo

At the end of last June, Kahler, Sahloul and an American surgeon at Northwestern Medical, Samer Attar, having crossed the Turkey-Syria border, found themselves on Castello Road, an open road bombed frequently and the only road left into East Aleppo.

Kahler had helped with Syrian refugees in camps in Jordan and Lebanon. In Haiti, he traveled with armed guards because of the threat of kidnapping by gangs.

Kahler said he imagined Aleppo would be "something akin" to that. He was wrong.

During a pause in bombings, in separate SUVs Khaler and his companions and drivers made their way past shells of bombed-out cars and trucks.

"When we got into the city we could smell burnt flesh...the smell of death was in the air, no doubt about that," he said.

Kahler and Sahloul's trip back out four days later was more terrifying, they said.

At the M10 and M2 hospitals (which now have been bombed out) Kahler saw at least 150 patients, he said. Many of them needed general care, but a number of children also had psychological problems. Many suffered from bed-wetting, anxiety, headaches and insomnia.

One child was so afraid to sleep inside the family's home because of the bombings that the father had to set up a tent in the courtyard, Kahler remembered.

Sahloul said that every day they heard explosions, but people continued to work.

"John was very cool; he took it very well." Sahloul said.

Attar met Kahler on that mission. his own second one which would last two weeks, but they became friends during that harrowing trip in.

"John has been going on medical missions throughout the world," Attar said. "There is no place he wouldn't go...I think he is a remarkable, selfless human. He sees the humanity in all of us."

A Life Lived in Service

Kahler said he has devoted most of his life to providing medical care to underserved areas, not only as a medical missionary but also in the 34 years he worked at Cook County Hospital in Chicago.

He credits the Carmelite Catholic education which stresses "service as well as spirituality" -he received at the former St. Joseph Elementary School and Joliet Catholic High School (now Joliet Catholic Academy). (Bold and Highlight this section)

But in the last four years, after a bout with cancer, "something changed in him" and he began to view his purpose differently.

"There was too much 'of me, for me' involved in those [previous] missions." Kahler said, adding that seeing the world was a part of those missions.

Now, he was looking for something "to leave in the world."

In April 2015, Kahler saw a "60 Minutes" segment on the sarin gas attack on the Ghouta region of suburban Damascus. More than a thousand civilians were reported to have been killed. Syrian rebels blamed Assad for the attack.

"The gassing and the sight of hundreds of children laid out in that warehouse haunted me," Kahler said. "I would wake up two to three nights a week with that nightmare."

Soon after Kahler joined SAMS. A Witness and a Cause to Die For About his desire to go to Aleppo, Kahler said that

it was less about sharing his medical expertise as wanting to bring awareness, especially in the United States, to the plight of the Syrian people.

Kahler felt more attention was paid in media and by the United States to the threat of ISIS and not the Syrian victims of Assad's bombings. He added that more attention is on civilians now since the sarin gas attack on the town of Khan Sheikhoun on April 4 and the subsequent U.S. airstrikes on a Syrian airfield.

Kahler said he wanted "to be a witness to what was going on" and support the local health care workers who "are the real heroes."

Both Kahler and Sahloul recounted a conversation last fall in which Kahler said he was willing to die to get attention for the Syrian people.

"I said, 'If the concept of an American martyr would [stimulate the U.S. to help stop the bombing of the Syrian people], - I would do that," Kahler said. "Not in an orange jumpsuit on your knees but as an American killed at the hospital."

Sahloul said Kahler wanted to go back into East Aleppo. Since the two left on June 30, the city has been besieged by the government with Castello Road

closed off.

They will not go to Aleppo yet, but in May Kahler and Sahloul are planning to go to another war-torn country - Yemen, as part of a SAMS Global Response Team medical mission.

As for Syria, Kahler said he wants "to walk in a peaceful Damascus." However, he is not optimistic about the future of the Syrian children who have experienced "a cultural disruption" or a unified Syria.

One night Kahler said he climbed to the top of M10.

"It was pitch black because there is no electricity in East Aleppo," Kahler said. "You look one way to-



wards the desert and you see rockets being dropped. You look the other way [towards West Aleppo] and all the lights are on."

Kahler and McClellan have been married almost 30 years and have a blended family of six children and 12 grandchildren.

She was an outstanding coach before and brings a ton of experience as a high school coach, private instructor, and collegiate dancer at Arizona State University. Patti Carbery (SFA '82) - Four-year varsity starter in basketball, softball, and tennis. Scored more than 1,000 points during her SFA career. Earned eight varsity letters at Yale in basketball and softball.

Emily Marino (JCA '97) - Earned 10 varsity letters in basketball, softball, and volleyball. Inducted into the ESCC Hall of Fame in 2008. Four-year starter at Florida in softball; still holds several Florida softball records.

Larry McKeon (JCHS '68) - Earned eight varsity letters in baseball, basketball, and football. Still holds Hilltopper career receiving yardage and receiving touchdown records. Hall of Fame high school football coach: 261-89 career record at Plainfield and Naperville North.

Dan Sharp (JCHS '74) - 199 victories and six state championships as Hilltopper head football coach ('97-'16). 223-69 overall career record as head coach at Minooka and JCA. Head of athletic department that saw unprecedented success during his tenure (11 state championships in 20 years).

David Sims (JCHS '80) - Won 1980 IHSA state title in the 500-meter freestyle: named JCHS Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Named to 1980 U.S. Olympic Swim Team. Set numerous school and Pac-10 records collegiately at Stanford University.

This year's legacy honoree (pre-WWII Joliet Catholic High School or SFA graduates) is Bill Sticklen (JCHS '43) - JCHS golf team captured Chicago Catholic League title three years in a row during his career. Inducted into the Chicago Catholic League Basketball Hall of Fame. Starred collegiately at Northwestern University in basketball and golf; leading golf to Big Ten Championship in 1949.

Joliet Catholic Academy history teacher Jason Midlock began JCA's spring Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony with a quote from legendary basketball coach and leadership author John Wooden, "a leader's most powerful ally is his or her own example." Inducted at the ceremony were three current staff members, with a combined total of 45 years of service to the JCA community, who all have one thing in common: they have consistently shown leadership through the daily example they set for students. The JCA community is proud to honor current faculty and

staff members Mr. Mark Clarke, Mr. Jose "Pepe" Herrera, and Mrs. Suzi Arnett.

Midlock, who is also the head of JCA's cross-country program, inducted his fellow history department teacher, and current cross-country assistant coach Mr. Mark Clarke, Mr. Clarke has been employed at JCA since 2005 in the Social Studies department. He retired after thirty-plus years of service at Troy District 30-C as a middle school teacher and coach. Coach Clarke, as he is affectionately known to many student-athletes at JCA, owns multiple masters degrees in teaching, and has spent his career as an athletic official, coach, and club moderator. Over twelve years at JCA he's coached girls basketball, cross-country, and currently serves as the moderator for JCA's chapter of Habitat for Humanity, History Club, and Psychology Club. Clarke thanked his late wife Lucy, who he credited as the "true teacher in their family", and his daughters Elizabeth, Mary, and Ann.

LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT

IRA Required Mandatory Distribution charitable tax break becomes permanent

Dear alumni, families, and friends



If you're required to take a minimum distribution from your IRA, you'll again have the option to make that distribution tax free by directing it to the charity of your choice.

These distributions can be a convenient way to support charitable causes and get a tax break while meeting tax requirements for IRAs.

You may have your Required Mandatory Distribution made payable directly to Joliet Catholic Academy as we meet the IRS definition of a qualified charity, and then designate it as a qualified charitable distribution on your tax return. You'll have satisfied your distribution requirement, and you won't have to pay income taxes on that money.

So if you're 70½ or older, you can transfer your 2017 RMD to charity at any time. The donation counts as your required minimum distribution but doesn't increase your adjusted gross income, which can be particularly helpful if you don't itemize and can't deduct charitable contributions. Also, keeping some or all of your RMD out of your adjusted gross income could help you avoid the Medicare high-income surcharge or help make less of your Social Security benefits taxable. (You can't double-dip tax breaks and deduct the charitable contribution if you make the tax-free transfer to charity.)

The money needs to be transferred directly from the IRA to JCA in order to be tax-free. If you withdraw it from the IRA first and then give it to JCA, you can deduct the gift as a charitable contribution (if you itemize), but the withdrawal will be included in your adjusted gross income.

Gifts can be directed to fund anything the donor would like to support at JCA including but not limited to scholarships, capital campaigns, individual sports, band, etc.
