## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT/PRINCIPAL



Dear JCA Alumni, Community and Friends,

It is with a grateful heart that I begin this letter looking back at the 2021-2022 school year and the accomplishments of our students and faculty and staff. We are forever appreciative for the kindness and support of our JCA community and with many exciting events happening currently on campus and celebrated throughout this past year, we can say that there is much hope and enthusiasm for the future of our Angels and Hilltoppers.

Strategically speaking, we will begin the next school year focusing on the last year of our current Strategic Plan, *Onward Together 2018-2023*. We have already addressed three-fourths of this plan and will

look to focus on our final strategies as the summer and next school year approach. With that said, we are always looking to improve and plan, so we are already organizing our thoughts and ideas for our **next** Strategic Plan and how that will coincide with our next capital campaign. We will always try to do what is best for our students and our school and get as many people from the JCA community involved as we can when creating our plans for the future. This year was an accreditation review year in which **Cognia**, our national review program, evaluated all facets of our school. I am happy to report that we have received a very favorable review with many compliments to the work of our faculty and staff, and they have suggested ways in which we can improve on the strong programs which are already in place. One of those suggestions is for us to break down our Strategic Plan to a more focused yearly, School Improvement Plan, which will take us from a big picture scenario to a more focused goal-oriented, yearly design.

We have had so much to celebrate this past year. We are currently considered a Microsoft Incubator Program School and are steps away from becoming a Microsoft Showcase School; one of only a handful named in Illinois. Also, we have four Microsoft Innovation in Education Experts on staff, with eight more faculty in the program and on their way to being named MIEE's. We have had the official opening of The Warning Innovation Research Center, which is the focal point of technology on campus and is allowing our students many new opportunities, which may have eluded them in the past. Our enrollment continues to be strong, with an average of 600 students these past eight years, and our ACT and AP scores continue to be among the highest in the state.

Along with our in-class successes, we have had a multitude of successes on the playing fields and in the gym. Our Wrestling Program won our first ever State Championship, with five wrestlers also placing in State. Our Football team won our 15th State Championship and our Girls' Volleyball, Dance, Cross Country, Girls Tennis, and Cheerleading teams all placed either individuals or teams into their respective State tournaments. Needless to say, we are proud of our student-athletes and the excellence that they portray in and out of the classroom.

I would like to end this letter by saying- **THANK YOU**. You have been instrumental in making our school a success year in and year out. Without the support of our alumni, donors, and JCA community, we would not be the school that we are today!

On behalf of our faculty, staff and students, I wish you continued blessings in all that you do!

Each summer Joliet Catholic Academy welcomes nearly 1,000 grade school students to the home of the Angels and Hilltoppers. JCA offers 19 different camps to accommodate campers' individual interests via Academic, Athletic, Activity, and Fine Art Camps. ## Adrian Guzman '17 chosen as first recipient of the Will County Legal Opportunity Scholarship

Congratulations to JCA alum Adrian Guzman '17 who was recently chosen as the first recipient of the Will County Legal Opportunity Scholarship.

Recipients of the scholarship are “eligible to receive up to \$46,000 to help repay outstanding legal education debt,” the Will County Bar Association website said. In return, the scholarship recipients will be expected to practice law in Will County.

Guzman, a political science major at University of St. Francis, is currently studying law at Northern Illinois College of Law. He is hoping to concentrate on criminal law and/or immigration law and said he is looking forward to practicing in Will county, perhaps as a public defender or in the state’s attorney’s office

“It’s nice to give back to the community you grew up in,” Guzman said.

Women’s Bar Association and Spesia & Taylor Attorneys at Law. A scholarship committee selected four finalists, the release said.

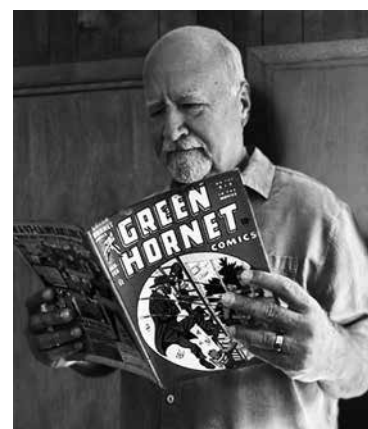
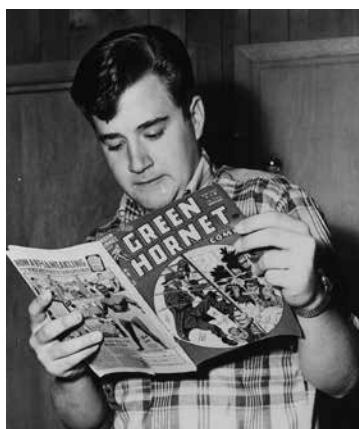

## From high school entrepreneur to career comic-book businessman: Gary Colabuono '69

Thirty-seven years ago, Gary Colabuono saw his first “ashcan,” a cheaply made, stapled-together black-and-white mock-up made to secure a comic book’s title and trademark with the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office. These “ashcans” were thrown in the garbage, or into legal files at a company like Marvel or DC Comics.

On April 7, 2022, Colabuono sold four ‘Superman Comics’ ashcans so rare most are not even in DC’s vaults, for \$408k at Heritage Auctions in Dallas. Colabuono is the only person on the planet to own all four in this collection (Superman, Superwoman, Superboy, and Supergirl) at once. This followed up a March 2021 sale of a rare ashcan copy of Action Comics No. 1 from 1937 that birthed Superman for \$250k. Colabuono’s connections in the industry led him to acquire the collection in 1985 from an author researching a book on comics, who had been given the collection from DC’s president at the time, who believed the “ashcans” to be worthless.

But one company’s trash became Colabuono’s treasure, not to



mention passion. As former Wizard Entertainment CEO Gareb Shamus once told the Chicago Tribune, “When you talk about collectibles, it’s all about having things that are rare and, in a lot of cases, one of a kind. What Gary has is a piece of history that people haven’t seen before. That’s what gets the juices flowing for





collectors out there.”

Colabuono graduated from Joliet Catholic High School in 1969. In the comic world, he’s known as “Moondog”, a national comic book expert and historian that has been featured on Good Morning America, CNBC, WGN, the Chicago Tribune, and the Daily Herald. But what turned into a career pursuit and lifetime passion, began as a hobby. Gary said, “everyone has a ‘golden age’ for comics, and I fell in love with the characters at ten years old.”

The hobby turned Colabuono into a budding entrepreneur while at “The Hill,” as featured in a May 1967 edition of “The Victory Light”, JCHS’s student newspaper. The feature stated, “Gary’s flare for old comic books started when he joined Scifi, which was a junior version of the Science Fiction Club of America (SFCA), which is the biggest organization that deals with novels and comics. As a kid, Gary read comic books for fun, now his passion has become a flourishing business.”

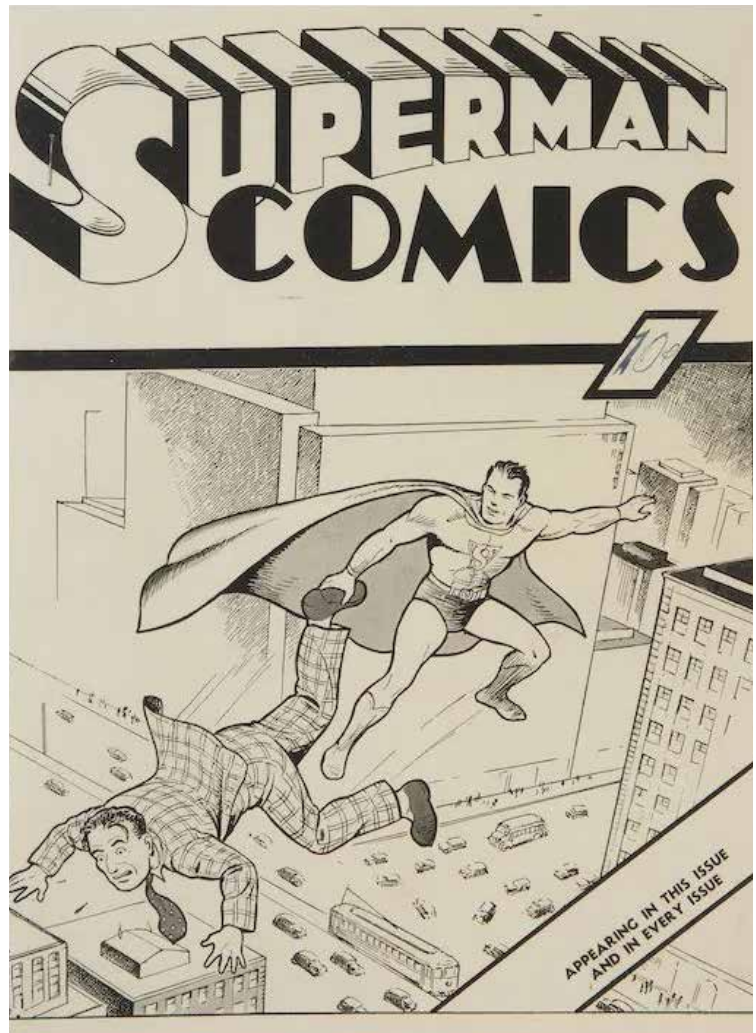
In 1967, Gary’s stock consisted of about 1,300 magazines, which he obtained from visiting used book shops like Cut-Rate Food Mart east of the Jefferson St. bridge down from the Hill. He spent many afternoons going through piles of paperbacks and comic books. The owner, George, would holler at him because he kept messing up his stacks of comics.

After graduating from NIU with a degree in journalism/advertising and working for the Daily Herald as a retail ad salesman, Colabuono took a leap of faith opening the Chicago suburb’s first comic bookstore, “Moondog’s Comic Shop” in 1978. By 1981, with a 5-month-old child and the support of his loving wife Patty, Gary quit his full-time job to focus on expanding his comic bookstore business, eventually growing from one 200 square foot location to a six-store chain, which he eventually sold in 1994.

Colabuono’s reputation in the comic world led to leadership positions locally. He attended the very first Chicago Comic in 1976 as a vendor, eventually becoming president and CEO of the convention in 1992, growing it from 5,000 fans at the O’Hare Ramada Inn to a 50,000-person event. He sold Chicago Comicon in 1997 to Wizard Entertainment. Today, Fan Expo/Chicago, debuting this summer at the Stephens Convention Center in Rosemont, is the current iteration of the show that Colabuono helmed back in the 90’s. Over 100,000 fans are expected to attend.

After selling his comic bookstores, Colabuono pursued another life’s passion in 1999, becoming marketing director for Incredible Technologies, the company responsible for “Golden Tee Golf”, rated as one of the top ten arcade games of all-time by Time magazine in 2011. Colabuono was a member of the JCHS golf team as a junior and earned a varsity letter as a senior in 1968-1969.

Even while spending thirteen years working for Incredible Tech,



Gary still collected; and he collected everything from comics to Mickey Mantle rookie cards. He developed a website based off his online persona, [ [moondogbuyscomics.com](http://moondogbuyscomics.com) ]moondogbuyscomics.com. Since 1984, he has been a trusted senior advisor to the Overstreet Comic Book Price Guide – the bible of the hobby. He helped create new comic book grading standards, understanding all the nuances that go into grading and pricing Golden Age (1930’s-1950’s), Silver Age (1960’s), and Bronze Age (1970’s) comics.

Colabuono and his classmates recently celebrated their 50th reunion in 2019. Gary said, “I loved my time at Joliet Catholic with the Carmelites and making lifelong friendships that last to this day.” Today, Gary spends his time operating his website, purchasing memorabilia for his collection, and out on the golf course. On his recent sale of Superman ashcans, Colabuono said, “These are all so cool, so important, and so rare. I have already owned all my ‘holy grails’, and I’ve been so proud to be a caretaker to these important works.”

The Warning Innovation Research Center caps off a Master

Plan formulated by Joliet Catholic Academy in 2000 that has seen significant upgrades to the campus at 1200 N. Larkin Ave., including the Student Activity Center, increases in parking, the creation of the North campus access road, new lighting, new hallway ceilings, classroom renovations, Heritage Quad, new windows and air conditioning throughout campus, the relocation and creation of the Mary, Our Sister Chapel, and finally The Warning IRC.

The Warning IRC is located inside the entire second story of the northeast wing of campus, which formerly housed the computer lab and old chapel. This space now includes the WJCA Broadcast Studio, a Research Center, five collaboration pods, Stem and Robotics Labs, an Engineering Lab, and an additional Exploration/Computer Lab.

# Hall of Champions

## Hon. Vincent F. Cornelius '82

Hon. Vincent F. Cornelius '82 was elected to serve as a Circuit Judge of the 12th Judicial Circuit Court of Will County in 2018. He serves in the felony trial division. Prior to his election, he was principal of the Law Offices of Vincent F. Cornelius for 23 years, with locations in Wheaton and Joliet. He began the practice of law in 1989 as the first African American prosecutor in the history of the DuPage County State's Attorney's Office. He was an associate attorney with the Law Offices of James D. Montgomery and Associates in Chicago, IL.



Vincent was raised in Joliet, IL, attending Edna Keith Elementary School, Washington Jr. High School, and Joliet Catholic High School. He is a graduate of the University of St. Francis, where he was named to the Academic All-America basketball team. He later returned to the University to serve as Vice-Chairman of the Board of Trustees. He is a recipient of the Joann Placher Distinguished Alumni Award and the Martin Luther King Journey Award from the University of St. Francis.

While a student at the Northern Illinois University College of Law, Vincent was a member of the Nation Mock Trial Team. He later served as a member of the College of Law's Alumni Council and Board of Visitors. He currently serves as the Chairman of the law school's Board of Visitors. He is a recipient of the distinguished Alumni Award from the NIU College of Law.

Vincent is a founding board member of the Black Bar Association of Will County. He has served as President of the Illinois State Bar Association, Chancellor of the Academy of Illinois Lawyers, President of the Illinois Bar Foundation. He was the first African American to hold each position. He is the only lawyer to serve in all three positions.

Vincent resides in Naperville, IL with his wife of thirty years, Zina. They are the proud parents of two adult children.

## Dr. Bill Nelson '73

Dr. Bill Nelson '73 has practiced Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery in Green Bay, WI for over 30 years. He was a founding and managing partner of BayCare Health Systems, BayCare Clinic and Aurora BayCare Medical Center in Green Bay. He has served as President of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and President



of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons. Currently Dr. Nelson has faculty appointments in the Department of Surgery at the University of Minnesota and the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health Western Clinical Campus.

Dr. Nelson presents nationally and internationally on health care ethics, physician executive leadership, and health care education. He has authored numerous medical journal articles and book chapters. He served as Medical Director of the Northeastern Wisconsin Regional Cleft Lip, Palate and Craniofacial Surgery Consortium and on the Sports Medicine Staff of the Green Bay Packers.

## Hilltoppers capture IHSA record 15th State Football Championship

DeKALB — Jordan Anderson steamrolled Sacred Heart-Griffin for 245 yards of total offense and three touchdowns in the Class 4A State Championship game. And that was just in the first half of his record-breaking performance.

The Joliet Catholic senior's huge night paced the Hilltoppers' 56-27 win on Friday as they claimed their 15th state championship at Northern Illinois University's Huskie Stadium.

Anderson ran for a 4A state-title game record 306 yards and scored four touchdowns. He also had two catches for 69 yards and a score.

"It was a great feeling," Anderson said. "I had to leave it out there for our last game. I just left it to the hogs out there and follow them up front. ... It's an honor to play with them."

For those hogs, the feeling is mutual.

"We're the best O-line in the nation," Josh Jones said. "It's a solid collective effort."

The Hilltoppers (14-0) outgained the Cyclones (12-2) 468-11 on the ground and 563-221 in total offense.

Sacred Heart-Griffin jumped out to a 6-0 lead when DeAndre Stewart returned the opening kickoff 99 yards. But Anderson and the Hilltoppers answered with a long drive capped with a 2-yard bulldozer of a run by the Illinois commit for a 7-6 lead.

After JCA forced a three-and-out, Jake Fieldman hauled in an 8-yard pass from Aidan Voss to extend the Hilltoppers' lead, and then Anderson rumbled 35 yards for a touchdown to give JCA a 20-6 lead with



9:36 left in the second quarter.

That's when turnovers started to plague the Cyclones. JCA's Ian Williams came up with an interception, setting up a deep pass from Voss to Anderson, who was left uncovered on the play and hauled in the 32-yard TD for a 28-6 lead with 4:31 left in the second quarter.

The Cyclones fumbled on their next drive, leading to a 2-yard run by Vinny Iannantone to stake the Hilltoppers to a 35-6 lead just before the break.

"It's all thanks to the hogs," said Iannantone, who had 127 yards rushing and two scores. "Those guys push and do what they have to and that's why Jordan and I are so successful."

Sacred Heart-Griffin did get one back before half. Quarterback Ty Lott marched the Cyclones 64 yards in three plays. Lott found Madixx Morris with 0:44 left to get within 35-13.

To start the second half, Tommy Thomas recovered an onside kick for Sacred-Heart Griffin, and the Cyclones needed just three plays for Lott to find KeShon Singleton for a 30-yard touchdown pass, getting to within 35-20 less than 2 minutes into the second half.

As fast as the Cyclones scored, the Hilltoppers answered with a long, sustained drive that ate up more than 7 minutes, capped with a 2-yard plunge by Iannantone to push the lead back to 42-20. Anderson added a fourth-quarter touchdown run of 26 yards, putting him over the record.

Morris and Lott connected against with 5:27 left to make the score 49-27. Anderson answered back with his fifth touchdown 2 minutes later to build the lead

back to 56-27.

"They've been working toward this since they were freshman," JCA coach Jake Jaworski said. "To be able to sit here now is special. It's very humbling. We're very blessed."

The Hilltoppers capped off the 2021 season on a 20-game winning streak, stretching back to their 2020 undefeated Covid-spring campaign.

Quarterback Aidan Voss and running back Vinny Iannantone were named to the IHSFCA Class 4A All-State Team. Head coach Jake Jaworski '02 was named the 2021 ESCC/CCL Orange Division Gillespie Coach of the Year. Senior offensive lineman Josh Jones was named the ESCC/CCL Orange Lineman of the Year, Iannantone was named ESCC/CCL Most Valuable Player, and Voss was named ESCC/CCL Offensive Most Valuable Player. Additionally, defensive back Tajhaun McClellan, linebacker Michael Rouse, linebacker Robbie Purchase III, receiver Jake Fieldman, and running back Jordan Anderson were named to the ESCC/CCL All-Conference Team. The Hilltoppers finished the year ranked No. 1 in Class 4A and No. 3 overall in the final Chicagoland Top 30 EdgyTim.com poll.





## Hilltopper Wrestling captures first Dual Team State Championship; Two Hillmen capture Individual Titles

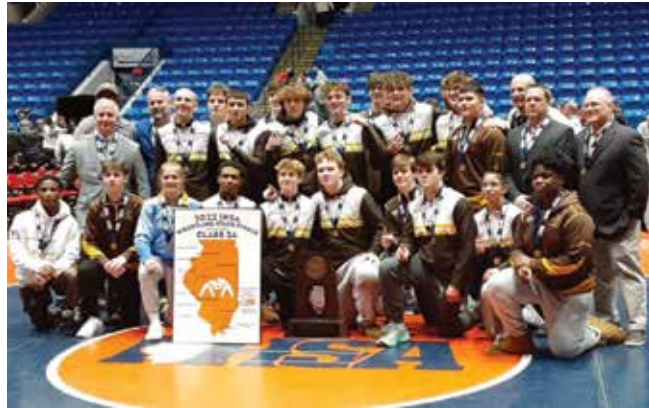
BLOOMINGTON – The seemingly unstoppable train that is the Joliet Catholic Academy wrestling team made its final stop Saturday night, securing the state championship at the Class 2A Dual Team State Wrestling Tournament with a 39-33 win over Deerfield.

The score is a bit deceiving, as the Hilltoppers were able to forfeit the final three matches after a pin by Shay Korhorn at 120 pounds gave them an insurmountable 39-15 lead with three matches remaining. It was the first team state wrestling title for JCA.

On Friday, the Hilltoppers beat Riverside-Brookfield, 65-7, in the quarterfinals before posting a 64-10 win over Antioch in Saturday's semifinals.

As has been the case all season, JCA individual state champions Dillan Johnson (285 pounds) and Gylon Sims (113) led the charge. Johnson capped an undefeated season with a pin in 47 seconds over Garvin Crews in the championship match, while Sims scored a 16-6 major decision over Jordan Rasof.

Johnson and Sims captured their individual titles the week preceding dual team state at the IHSA Class 2A Individual Finals in Champaign on the campus of the University of Illinois. The Hillmen also had a record five wrestlers place: Mason Alessio finished 2nd at 145 lbs., Owen Gerdes 4th at 195 lbs., and Owen O'Connor finished in 5th at 138 lbs. Shay Korhorn, Logan Kuhel-Trimmer, and Caden Moore all qualified for the state finals, giving JCA wrestling another program record with



nine state qualifiers. The ninth wrestled the following weekend, as freshman wrestler Grace Laird became the first female wrestler in school history to qualify for the IHSA inaugural Girls State Wrestling finals.

"I am always in attack mode," Johnson said about his penchant for quick pins.

Early in the match, it was Deerfield in attack mode.

Joliet Catholic's Mason Alessio won the opening match at 145, scoring a 12-0 major decision over Lucio Morgan. JCA's Connor Cumbee was next with a 7-6 win over Stamos Tsakiris before Deerfield's Benjamin Shvartsman pinned JCA's Isaac Clauson in 2:42 to pull the Warriors to within 7-6.

At 170, Aiden Cohen won by a 20-5 technical fall over Nick Ronchetti to put Deerfield ahead 11-7. A 19-7 major decision by Deerfield's Braeden Wittkamp over Caden Moore put the Warriors up 15-7.

The Hilltoppers' Owen Gerdes won a 13-1 major decision over Devian Schwartz, and Hunter Powell scored a pin over Max Drunke in 4:43 before Johnson's quick pin gave JCA a 23-15 lead.

The wins kept coming for JCA, as Noah Avina won by pin in 1:38 at 106 pounds, and Sims picked up a win before Shay Korhorn stepped up to wrestle Luke Reddy

in the 120-pound match and his team leading, 33-15.

All Korhorn needed was a win, but the senior got more. He put Reddy in a cradle and clinched the dual state championship with a pin at the 3:02 mark.

"I've been doing the cradle since I was 5," Korhorn said. "When I went out there, coach [Ryan Cumbee] told me that all I had to do was win and we clinched the title. To get it with a pin

is extra.

"I have put a lot of blood and sweat into this team for four years. A week ago [at the individual tournament], I didn't do as well as I hoped. But to win it as a team, that feels 10 times better than the individual would have. No one else knows what we have been through. There is a bond like brothers."

Deerfield picked up forfeit wins at 126 by Jackson Palzet, 132 by Renzo Morgan, and 138 by Kai Neumark to provide the final score, and the Hilltoppers bench and crowd went crazy.

"This means so much to do it as a team," Ryan Cumbee said after fighting off tears of joy. "If you win it as an individual, it's success for one person. But this, it was 21 guys who did this. They believed in themselves and in each other. They trusted each other.

"I was fortunate enough to win a title as an individual and as a part of a team. It was 21 times better to win the team title because it was for everybody."

Johnson had faith in his teammates despite trailing early in the match.

"I trusted everybody that we could come back," he said. "I wasn't worried at all. We have put in the work from Day 1."
